ordinance no. 35

AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING THE HEREINAFTER DESCRIBED TERRITORY TO THE CITY OF ANGUS, NAVARRO COUNTY, TEXAS, AND EXTENDING THE BOUNDARY LIMITS OF SAID CITY SO AS TO INCLUDE SAID HEREINAFTER DESCRIBED PROPERTY WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS, AND GRANTING TO SAID TERRITORY AND TO ALL FUTURE INHABITANTS OF SAID PROPERTY ALL OF THE RIGHTS AND PRIVILEGES OF OTHER CITIZENS AND BINDING SAID FUTURE INHABITANTS BY ALL OF THE ACTS AND ORDINANCES OF SAID CITY.

WHEREAS, a petition for annexation has been duly signed and acknowledged by each and every person or corporation having an interest in the territory described in Exhibit "B" attached hereto, and

WHEREAS, said tract of land is contiguous and adjacent to the City of Angus, Texas and which lies within the city's extraterritorial jurisdiction as relinquished by the City of Corsicana, and on which not more than three (3) qualified voters reside, and

WHEREAS, the City of Angus has prepared a service plan for said tract which is attached as Exhibit "A" to this Ordinance, and

WHEREAS, the city has published notice of hearings on said annexation and held hearings as required by state law, and

WHEREAS, after hearing such petition and the arguments for and against the same, the city council has voted to grant such petition and to annex said territory to the City of Angus, Texas;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ANGUS, TEXAS:

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That the territory described in Exhibit "B" attached hereto be and the same is hereby annexed to the City of Angus, Navarro County, Texas, and that the boundary limits to the City of Angus, Texas, be and the same are hereby extended to include the above described territory within the city limits of the City of Angus, Texas, and the same shall hereafter be included within the territorial limits of said city, and said land and the future inhabitants thereof shall hereafter be entitled to all rights and privileges of other citizens of the City of Angus, Texas, and shall be bound by the acts and ordinances of said city.

The City Secretary is hereby directed to file with the County Clerk of Navarro County, Texas, a certified copy of this Ordinance.

#### SERVICE PLAN FOR ANNEXED AREA

AREA ANNEXED: Lots 1 through 37, Shady Creek Subdivision owned by Gene Thomas and Raymond Trotter located on Farm Road 739 adjacent to the east boundary of the City of Angus more completely described in the public notices and ordinances required as a part of these annexation proceedings.

Municipal services to the area described above shall be furnished by or on behalf of the City of Angus, Texas, at the following levels and in accordance with the following schedule:

#### A. POLICE SERVICE

Patrolling, responses to calls, and other routine police services, within the limits of existing personnel and equipment, will be provided on the same basis as in other areas of the city.

#### B. FIRE SERVICES

Fire protection will be provided by the present personnel and the present equipment of the Angus Volunteer Fire Department, on the same basis as in other areas of the city.

# C. ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH AND SANITATION AND CODE ENFORCEMENT SERVICES

- (1) Enforcement of the city's environmental health and sanitation ordinances and regulations, including but not limited to, weed and brush ordinances, junked and abandoned vehicle ordinances, and animal control ordinances, shall be provided on the same basis as in other areas of the city.
- (2) The city's building, plumbing, electrical, and all other construction codes will be enforced within this area on the same basis as in other areas of the city.

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#### D. PLANNING SERVICES

The planning jurisdiction of the city will extend to this area on the effective date of the Annexation Ordinance.

## E. SOLID WASTE COLLECTION

Solid waste collection shall be provided to the property in accordance with existing city policies, beginning with the effective date of the Annexation Ordinance on the same basis as may be provided in other areas of the city.

#### F. STREETS AND LIGHTING

The City of Angus's existing policies with regard to street maintenance and street lighting applicable throughout the entire city, shall apply to this property beginning with the effective date of the Annexation Ordinance.

#### G. WATER SERVICE


Upon connection to existing mains, water service will be provided by the Angus Water Supply Corporation on the same basis as in other areas of the city.

## H. SANITARY SEWER SERVICES

No sanitary sewer shall be provided to this area by the city.

# I. <u>MISCELLANEOUS</u>

General municipal administration and administrative services of the city shall be available to the annexed area beginning with the effective date of the Annexation Ordinance.


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
