AMBRICOR OF CANNORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES AMENDOF THE CITY OF ANGUS, TEXAS TO AMEND SECTION FOR PENALTIES FOR PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION; PROVIDING FOR A FINE NOT TO EXCEED DOLLARS (\$500.00) EXCEPT FOR A FINE GOV VIOLATIONS OF ORDINANCES THAT GOVERN FIRE SHALL ATION IN WHICH CASES THE FINE SHALL NOT EXCEED TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,000.00): PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT; TO THE REPEAL OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ANGUS, TEXAS:

#### SECTION I

ordinaThat Chapter (loof the Code of Ordinances of the City of Angus, organs secTexas Sis hereby amended to amend section 5 which shall read as follows:

## VIOSECTION 05:00 GENERAL PENALTY FOR VIOLATIONS OF CODE

Whenever in this code or in any ordinance of the city, an act is prohibited or is made or declared to be unlawful or an offense or a misdemeanor, or wherever in such code or ordinance the doing of an act is required or the failure to do any act is declared to be unlawful, and no specific penalty is provided therefor, the violation of any such provision of this code or any such ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500.00), except for violations of municipal ordinances that govern fire safety, zoning and public health and sanitation, including dumping of refuse, in which cases a fine not to exceed two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) is hereby authorized; provided, however, that no penalty shall be greater or less than the penalty provided for the same or similar offense under the laws of the state. Each day any violation of this code or of any ordinance shall continue shall constitute a separate offense.

The city may also bring suit for injunction against any person that shall violate or threaten to violate any of the provisions of this Code of Ordinances in order to prevent a continued violation or threatened violation.

#### SECTION II

That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

#### SECTION III

That it is hereby declared to be the intention of the city council that the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, and phrases of this ordinance are severable and, if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section of this ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and sections of this ordinance, since the same would have been enacted by the city council without the incorporation in this ordinance of any such unconstitutional phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section.

#### SECTION IV

That whenever in this code or in any ordinance of the city, an act is prohibited or is made or declared to be unlawful or an wherever in such code or ordinance the doing of an act is required or the failure to do any act is declared to be unlawful, and no specific penalty is provided therefor, the violation of any such provision of this code or any about by such ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500.00), except for violations of municipal ordinances that govern fire safety, zoning and public health and sanitation, including dumping of refuse, in which cases a fine Sinot to exceed two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) is hereby authorized; provided, however, that no penalty shall be greater or less than the penalty provided for the same or similar offense under the laws of the state. Each day any violation of this code or of any ordinance shall continue shall constitute a separate offense. The city may also bring suit for injunction against any person that shall violate or threaten to violate any of the provisions order to prevent a continued violation or threatened violation.

#### SECTION V

That this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and the publication of the caption, as the law in such cases provides.
